MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR

We have packed Halloween decorations and pulled out Christmas boxes. Veterans Day is the 11th of the month. Reign of Christ Sunday falls on the 23rd. The first Sunday of Advent will be at the end of the month just a couple of days after Thanksgiving.

We think about how to answer the question, "For what are you asking at Christmas?". At the same time, we're to answer, "For what are you the most thankful at Thanksgiving?"

The other day, I ventured into the front garden area of the church. The attendant pointed out a shoot from one plant and explained that it is just a "sucker". It doesn't produce any blooms and doesn't present anything useful. "I keep it and trim it anyway", explained the attendant.

When I gathered the Halloween material and unpacked Christmas and Thanksgiving stuff, I proposed that all is just a "sucker". It hasn't much use and produces very little. (I keep it anyway – every year.)

Much of our surroundings are "suckers" that seem to produce nothing of worth. Much of the sermons, prayers, readings, and text studies may seem to be "suckers" – what to do with this?

Some things do not need to be defined by the perceived "value". Much of what we do produces little if anything. The internal comfort is the hopeful assertion that, someday, this will come in "handy".

Such it is for the hope-filled activity of the church – of mission. Someday, this will come in handy. Judgement seems to produce nothing of use. Searching/seeing the fulfillment as God's intent <u>and</u> "coming in handy" becomes something for which we are the most thankful.

Our blessing and our challenge is to "see" the usefulness within the divine creating and declaring it "the item most thankful".



COMMUNITY BABY SHOWER

The Merced County Community Action Agency (MCCAA) in Merced is hosting a Community Baby Shower on November 14, 2025, at the Italo Lodge. They have asked community groups and churches to put together baskets of essential items for pregnant and postpartum women who are having challenges navigating their new life changes. These women have been referred to MCCAA by their doctors and do not have any support systems.

The Senior Brown Bag Program provides supplemental nutritious groceries twice a month to over 3,850 seniors at 16 distribution sites in Merced and Mariposa Counties. Without the Senior Brown Bag Program, many seniors in Merced and Mariposa counties would be extremely isolated and at increased risk for malnourishment and illness.

There is no cost to the individuals served and eligibility is determined by using the federal income guidelines for poverty. The Senior Brown Bag program is designed to help those whose main source of income is Social Security, and who normally have to choose between nutritious foods and crucial medications

Senior Brown Bag Program participants are also provided with opportunities to volunteer at their food pickup site, which offers them social connections and a sense of belonging and purpose as they contribute to the Food Bank.

Every month, more than 200 volunteers gather at the various Senior Brown Bag sites to sort, bag, and distribute food to their peers. Many participants have built new friendships and a sense of community by volunteering.

Donations may be given to Shepherd of the Valley Lutheran Church with Senior Brown Bag on the memo line to be forwarded.
