CALL COMMITTEE "CURRENTS"

The "Current" Call Committee of 2023 and the Congregation Council members met November 8, 2023, with Pastor Manda Truchinski, Pastor Jerilyn Dhalke, and Pastor John Russell-Curry. The requirements and procedures needed to work together with the Presbytery, our Sierra Pacific Synod, and Shepherd of the Valley Merced (SOV) were reviewed to proceed with a Minister of Word and Sacrament half-time Call. The Draft #1 Compensation package was reviewed and discussed with some concerns expressed. It was approved to take it to the Congregation Council for consideration on November 13, 2024.

The Compensation package and housing allowance motions for 1-1-2024 to 12-31-2024 were presented and approved by the Congregation Council on November 13, 2024. Copies were signed by President David Cherf and Pastor John Russell-Curry and shared with Pastor Manda and Pastor Jerilyn by email that evening.

The Congregation Council also approved increasing the Supply Pastor salary to be paid for working more hours in December 2023.

A Special Congregational Meeting is scheduled December 3, 2023 to allow voting members of SOV to vote to offer the half-time Call to Pastor John Russell-Curry. After approval of the Call, the compensation package will be presented for a vote.

PROPERTY REPORT

November 11, 2023

HVACS: Haven't had any more problems from the 10 HVAC units.

GARAGE DOOR: Garage door being used by Healthy House giving some problems still.

FENCE: We are watching a section of fence.

OUTDOOR LIGHTS: Still have 8 bulbs that need to be put in.

INDOOR LIGHTS: We are still replacing the old fluorescent bulbs with energy efficient LED bulbs. This takes time to remove the ballasts and rewire the fixtures.

SPRINKLERS: Will need to replace some in the front courtyard. Need to find leak in center 'round' planter.

CLEAN-UP SATURDAYS: A small group of us have been vacuuming, sweeping, cleaning windows and windowsills, and changing out toilet paper rolls and such. I hear your complaints, but we are saving \$8,400 a year with our monthly clean-up.

POWERPOINT, ZOOM, PA SYSTEM: We have a constant 60-70 views of our weekly services on ZOOM and later on Facebook. The PowerPoint issue was resolved.

HOMELESS: Haven't heard of any more problems.

GROUNDS: Steve continues to water the tree by garage. Dylan, David II and I will be out this next month clearing out weeds and grass around the garden beds

Next to children, seniors are the most vulnerable group at risk of hunger. Senior food insecurity has risen as a result of the recession. The number of seniors at risk of hunger in 2015 was 70% higher than in 2007. Pre-seniors between the ages of 55 and 64, are particularly vulnerable as they are not yet of retirement age and thus ineligible for safety net programs like Medicare and Social Security.

Merced County Food Bank's Senior Brown Bag Program provides supplemental nutritious groceries twice a month to over 2,400 older adults (ages 55+) at 16 distribution sites in Merced and Mariposa Counties.

Without the Senior Brown Bag Program, many seniors in Merced and Mariposa counties would be extremely isolated and at increased risk for malnourishment and illness. Many seniors are forced to make difficult but unavoidable choices such as whether to purchase their medications, pay for their housing, and/or pay their utilities. Buying food, especially nutritious food, is often last on their list.

Sample Senior Brown Bag food items:

Chicken, Eggs, Fresh Produce, Cereal, Rice, Other staple items

Senior Brown Bag Program participants are provided with opportunities to volunteer at their food pickup site, which offers them social connections and a sense of belonging and purpose as they contribute to the Food Bank. Every month, more than 200 volunteers gather at the various Senior Brown Bag sites to sort, bag, and distribute food to their peers. Many participants have built new friendships and a sense of community by volunteering.

Donations may be given to Shepherd of the Valley Lutheran Church with Senior Brown Bag Program on the memo line to be forwarded.
