Spiritual Reflection by

Nan Mengebier Dailey

So, do we all have our 2022 resolutions and goals, lists, and plans meticulously organized with key dates marked with different colored pens in/on our desk calendars? I wish! What I do have, though, is a "sacred word" for the next year. Christine Valtners Painter first introduced me to the idea of having a single word (though in her design it need not be a "sacred" word) that can be identified through prayer, contemplation, meditation, sitting in silence, walking a labyrinth, indeed virtually anything that allows one to move inward towards one's heart and soul while letting the chattering mind go out for lunch She suggests that such a word can become a symbol or talisman during an individual's internal journey in the following year.

What I've done the last couple of years is make a list of what I experience as sacred words. This is not an analytic practice for me. I try not to think but to feel my way. I really just free associate – after, of course, sending <u>my</u> criticizing ego out to lunch.

Here are some words I've identified for 2022: Holy, Worship, Comfort, Love, Light, Share, Justice, Grief, Serve, Sacrifice, Joy, Journey, Peace, Hope, Celebrate, Rejoice, Rebirth, Pray, Holy Spirit, Sacred Darkness, Teach, Blessing.

Next I'll read the list slowly either out loud or to myself – noticing which (if any) word(s) have "appeal for me. I read it as many times as I need/want and let the words roll around in me until I "settle" on one. I can't really articulate for you what it is that causes me to settle on one word as opposed to another. But it's kind of like when I am trying to pick a dish to cook. I look through my loose recipes and probably some cookbooks, until I decide "Yup. That's the one I want to make." But what goes into that "Yup"? Well, it's things like the time it takes, or the ingredients required or whether I want a triedand-true recipe I'm familiar with or one that sends me waaaay out of my comfort zone. And no, we are NOT going to talk puff pastry here. But the point is, those are not factors I go into the process consciously thinking about.

Similarly, there must be factors that affect which word I "settle on" but I've not been successful in identifying them. So, the best I can tell you, if you want to try this out, is to feel your way through it. What word touches your core?

Once I've settled on a word, I let it serve throughout the year as a guide for me; or a goal; or a check in point. Or maybe it's a signpost, a boundary, or a threshold. Now I'm sure if I listen hard enough, I can hear you all muttering "Come on, Nan! What the heck does **that** mean???"

Well, let me try an example. When I am going through the valley of the shadow of death or the dark night of the soul, both of which I experience at times, I usually feel lost, alone, despairing. My word could help me reach out to the Divine. Or it might help me remember that I am not alone. Or it might remind me of a prayer that says just exactly what I need to say, or a passage(s) in scripture that feels relevant.

I realize this has all probably been more than a bit vague, but I hope that it may at least have given you an idea of how "working" with your sacred word, might draw you closer in relationship to our God.

For those who have been concerned about Pastor John Russell-Curry, we have received an update from him.

It's been almost a full year...

Early in the morning on December 28, 2020, I was taken to the hospital in an ambulance due to severe pain in the back that prevented me from almost all movement. I spent 6 weeks flat on my back at Mercy Hospital, UCSF, and a rehab facility. (Due to COVID, I had no visitors all that time, and was not allowed to leave my room - even very few staff members could enter. Very seldom did I have the privilege of looking out a window.) All interaction with Shepherd of the Valley was interrupted in a very brief "flash" of a moment. Besides the physical impositions, my pain and depression over the situation interfered with almost all contacts.

I have never "finished" thinking about that day. I was experiencing one of the biggest "moments" of my life being involved with the challenges of SOV - the ever-changing COVID restrictions and the creativity used to meet the needs of worship in such times. I was "riding high"! and enjoying every single moment and every single interaction with each congregation member. I enjoy and treasure each and every one of you - and remember you all fondly.

Recovery remains slow, but steady. I can walk a bit, but am in constant pain no matter what I do. It is unpleasant and debilitating if I venture to walk, stand, sit, lie down, drive a car, bend over... (so I try to avoid such activities). It is very humbling and sad to me to explain to my three-year-old grandson that grandpa is unable to get down on the floor to play (besides hurting to get down, I can't get up).

I'm still involved with medical/therapeutic intervention.

For the tiny few of you who have spoken to me, I've freely shared that it's not just my physical condition that interferes with resuming "normal" duties/interactions. I have noticed reduced cognitive functioning (but, it seems to improve slowly alongside the physical improvements).

I have learned a lot!

I have learned much about the medical world that I didn't want to know.

I have learned that I needed to learn about situations that are so common to a significant percentage of people throughout our community and throughout God's creation. I am smarter than I was - however, I remain weaker than before.

I suspect this weakness is making me much better at meeting the needs of those I meet and serve.

I truly wish only the best for the future of Shepherd of the Valley Lutheran Church and all who are associated.
