NEWS FROM THE COUNCIL

(From May 17 Council Meeting)

- The Actual Net Income for April 2022 was \$10,023.29, and our YTD Actual Net Income is \$39,180.92. Our total assets are \$288,724.45.
- A roof leak was recently discovered and continues to be monitored. Carolyn Stephens is working with the Property Committee to obtain an accurate cost estimate for repairs. This may cost as much as \$20,000-\$30,000.
- If the roof repairs will cost a substantial amount, a fundraiser will likely be planned to help cover costs.
- The new council members (Pam Andersen, Carolyn Stephens, David Cherf Jr., and Marc Medefind) plan to be inducted during the church service on May 22, 2022. David Cherf is returning as Council President, Steve Hand will serve as Vice President, and Amy Sofranek will continue as Secretary.
- Pastor Jack has proposed a plan for communion during the months of June and July. We will serve communion on the 1st and 3rd Sundays of each month, and use the 2nd and 4th Sundays to learn more about communion. The council approved of this idea.

We are now partners with The Fuller Center for Housing which was founded by Millard and Linda Fuller who started Habitat. They wanted to keep the original principles of Christianity such as the no interest loans for families who worked hard to have a home of their own, etc.

We strive to follow the example of Millard Fuller who founded Habitat with the vision of every family in an affordable, decent home which has been our vision as well. With the new Habitat requirements that every ReStore must have two paid employees on staff every day it was open, the Board voted to go with Fuller which is following the original grass roots and continue with all volunteers.

We operate a ReUse Store in Atwater on Third and Broadway. This store is operated by volunteers and is currently open 3 days a week (Wednesday, Friday and Saturday from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m.) As of June 1, we are hoping to be open on Thursdays as well. All funds generated are used to support and build homes for deserving families.

Donations may be given to Shepherd of the Valley Lutheran Church with Habitat/The Fuller Center on the memo line to be forwarded.

Communion in June and July

Pastor Jack, in coordination with the Church Council and Altar Guild planners, will offer a special two-month Summer emphasis on the sacrament of Communion.

We will have the eucharist as usual on the first and third Sundays of June and July. But on the other Sundays in June and July, we will have a special series of **"Sacramental Moments"** during the usual place for communion.

During those Sundays, we will not serve communion, but Pastor Jack will lead us in biblical and historical teachings on such themes as the meaning of communion, Christ as Host, what Luther emphasized about why we eat and drink, confession, the elements, and ways of partaking of communion.

Years ago, our church had communion on the first and third Sundays. This year, we will have that same order, but only in two of the Summer months – June and July. Communion every Sunday will resume in August.

This will give our members and guests a chance to both learn about and partake of the holy sacrament. It will be an enriching opportunity for us all.

SPIRITUAL REFLECTION by Nan Mengebier Dailey

I have always had a particular fondness for the disciple Simon Peter. He blunders around a lot (think “let’s build three huts” (Matthew 17:4), he’s an open mouth insert foot kind of guy (think, “And he began to rebuke him” (Matthew 16:22) but one thing he has going for him is he seems to have been an experienced fisherman. Matthew’s gospel (4:18) reads:

“As he walked by the Sea of Galilee, he saw two brothers, Simon, who is called Peter, and Andrew his brother, casting a net into the sea—for they were fishermen.” (emphasis mine)

Now, these were not folks out for a fun afternoon dropping their line in the water and popping a cold brewski. Peter and Andrew, as well as James and John were serious about their business. It was their livelihood and how, both directly and indirectly, they fed their families. They knew what they were doing.

So, in Luke 5:5 when, in response to Jesus’ instruction to throw the nets in off the right side of the boat, Peter says “Master, we’ve worked hard all night and haven’t caught anything. But because you say so, I will let down the nets.” he knows what he is talking about. He’d almost certainly had the same experience many times and that experience had taught him that if he hadn’t caught anything all night long, throwing the nets in

off the other side of the boat was not going to make one dog gone particle of difference.

But guess what? The outcome was **hugely** different. When they pulled it in, the net was almost bursting from the weight of all the fish.

Was it because all the fish in the Sea of Galilee had been swimming throughout the night on the right side of the boat teeheeing to each other because “that big guy who thinks he’s such a pro fisherman” had been totally bamboozled?

Of course not. It happened for two reasons. First of all, Jesus said, “Do it differently. Do it my way.” And secondly, Peter, bless his heart, skeptical as he might have been from past experience, trusted our Lord and Savior and “because you say so” let go of his infallible fishing knowledge and did it differently.

So, I ask myself: How often do I keep doing the same thing over and over again even if there is no payoff, even if nothing happens, even if nothing and nobody ever gets better? And even more important, why? Why do I fall down 7 times, get up 8 and do the exact thing again instead of saying, “My rump is really sore, there has **got** to be a different way to do this”? Why do I shut myself down in anger when I feel hurt rather than reaching past my ego with compassion? Why don’t I listen for the voice of God reminding me of how differently Jesus did things from the norms of his time?

So, I’ve come up with a challenge for all of us. The next time we find ourselves once more with a sore rump and nothing to show for it, let’s **Stop**. Let’s stop and listen and wait for the voice. And perhaps, just perhaps we’ll hear something like “Hey, try it off the other side of the boat.”
