## **MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR**

I wonder about the role of a pastor... I wonder a lot and often.

I seek and wish for feedback about my performance, but I don't get much. I hope that receiving some sort of criticism might include a little bit of positive feedback, and that harsh criticism might be "gentle" in nature.

After one pulpit supply occasion in Tracy, a parishioner handed me a note. It said, "You aren't getting paid by the word. You're getting paid by the souls saved."

A congregation member here admitted to me, "Well, you do tend to be a bit 'wordy".

On February 25, 2025, it will be the one-year anniversary of my installation as pastor of SOV. The required pastor's report at the annual congregation meeting at the end of January might reveal some of progress/attention proposed and made during that year.

Admittedly, I had/have no idea what I am doing. I suspect being "newly installed" might resemble a new stepparent. I have encountered some reflections about children of one parent "dating". The date might be kind and supportive to the children of a possible new family, but the children learn to not "leave themselves exposed". One "date" might hang around a while, but might disappear to be substituted by another.

It must be difficult being a child in a "separated" family.

A stepparent has very little knowledge of "how things are done". The stepparent tends to be the "disrupter" rather than the reconciler.

Over time, fewer disruptions might occur as new family configurations become the "norm".

When there is reconciliation and wholeness, there is the "saved soul".

A pastor does, indeed, get paid by the word, but it's with the capital "W" – the presentation of the Word as given to us in John 1: 1.

## Annual Fiscal Meeting Report By Marc Medefind, Council President

The Shepherd of the Valley Congregation gathered for the annual Fiscal Meeting on Jan, 26. All church committee chairpersons reported on their committee's work in 2024 as well as plans and prospective changes for 2025.

Five Church Council Nominating Committee members were elected, including Pam Andersen, Chris Love, Jan Collins, Carolyn Stephens and Judy Westerberg. Steve Hand, Jan Collins and Mary Jo Knudsen will term out in May leaving three council positions to fill. Tim and Pat Shaw were also elected to represent Shepherd of the Valley at the annual Synod Assembly on June. 14.

The congregation also voted to accept the treasurer's report, presented by Mona Kowalczyk, and adopted the 2025 Congregational budget. Our year-ending balance sheet showed total assets at \$229,684.61. The best news on the budget front was that the church finished with income more than \$21,000 above what was budgeted while expenditures were approximately \$9,000 over budget.

Financial Secretary Chris Boyenga said 23 families pledged just over \$71,000 for 2025. Chris also presented a graph that showed most of the church giving was in the \$1,000-\$3,000 per family range. Regarding membership, it was noted that the church has 105 voting members currently on record.

A request for compensation for Sunday service AV work was referred to the Church Council.

Pastor John opened and closed the meeting with prayer. His report noted that during his first full year at Shepherd of the Valley, he has many times asked "What did you do last year?"

"All of what we do and what can be accomplished is due to the tireless presence and support of God's Holy Spirit who never tires of hearing me ask, "Now what? What did we do last year?" . . . The Holy Spirit responds, "Wait 'til next year! Creation is all about possibility," he noted. "It all comes from divine intervention. Let that never go unspoken, nor left empty in our hearts.

## PROPERTY REPORT January 10, 2025 December - January

HVACS: Haven't had any problems with the furnaces/heat.

FENCE: Abutting property owners are not wanting to replace our shared fences because of the cost. We will be looking at alternatives.

OUTDOOR LIGHTS: Bulbs were ordered and are getting replaced.

FIRE SAFETY CHECKS: Over the past 2 months, all of our fire safety inspections were completed with the help of Caroline D. overseeing that they were done in a timely manner.

SPRINKLERS: Leak in a main valve box in front is being looked at by a gardener.

POWER POINT, ZOOM, PA SYSTEM: We have a constant 40-50 views of our weekly services on ZOOM on Facebook. Our power point operator says that we do not have enough RAM for the power point program, which in turn, causes the screen outages.

SPRINKLERS: I have turned down the sprinkler times to a minimum. We have always shut off the sprinklers until spring, but I was told that this causes the sprinkler gaskets to get stuck and decay making lots of sprinklers needing to be fixed in the spring.

HOMELESS: So far this winter we have had no incidents with our homeless community. We will continue to monitor.

OFFICE DOOR: Carolyn D. has notified that this door will need be to be fixed soon.

All seems to be going well, we have been fixing problems as they arise.
