(From July 12 Council Meeting)

• The YTD Actual Net Income is \$11,479. Our total assets are \$287,390.54.

• The Call Committee is in the process of interviewing a pastoral candidate and is effectively communicating with the council. Updates will be given when necessary.

• The church roof is in need of repairs, and the money will need to be fundraised. For now, the council is in the process of obtaining a quote for temporary patching.

• In order to save money, the council has agreed to dismiss the current cleaning crew. We are hoping to have enough volunteers from the congregation in order to clean the church ourselves. Please let a councilmember know if you would like to volunteer, or if there are any reasonably priced cleaning services that you recommend.
